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# 30 Days to Increasing your Social Media Clout

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## Introduction:

Business needs to reflect the reality of the clients who are living in the information age. Your client today is “interpersonal, logical, spatial, intrapersonal, musical, linguistic, naturalist and bodily-kinesthetic person”. Attempting to engage digital native potential clients with methods that are no longer valid, is like taking ads space out on CB radios; the only choice is to change the way we approach marketing. Unfortunately, no matter how much your company may wish it, it is highly unlikely the Digital Natives clients will go backwards. In the first place, it may be impossible—their brains may already be different because of their access to social network and on demand vast amounts of information. Businesses need to exist in the spaces the clients exist, understand their culture. You have no credibility if you are not where they are. They are using computers, videogames, digital music players, video cams, cell phones, and all the other toys and tools of the digital age. Today’s average college grads have spent less than 5,000 hours of their lives reading, over 10,000 hours talking on cell phones but over 10,000 hours playing video games (not to mention 20,000 hours watching TV).” And send 200,000 emails or instant messages. In 1999, tweens spent an average of 2.4 hours a week surfing the net and in 2000 that increased to 3.8 hours a week. The information age allows the people the opportunity to “create, consume, remix and share material with each other”. They ask many questions, as reflected in the “estimated 7.8 billion searches made in the United States.

The social networking tools bring a completely different set of tools into the hands of the digital natives. The popularity of these tools has surprised and frightened the ‘Digital Immigrants’ to the state where most business, rather than embracing these tools, have banned them. The banning of facebook, instant messaging, blogs, wikis, RSS feeds, myspace, social bookmarking, podcasts, youtube, and flicker, just to mention a few , has made a huge statement that business world is not adapting to its changing clients are not willing to join the ‘Digital Natives’ in their world. We could use the web2.0 tools to help reach clients. It is necessary to believe the power of technology is our friend. Ignorance is our enemy. ‘Digital Immigrant’ business leaders can continue to think that it is possible with a dated system of marketing to compete with the information age which is a reality to the “Digital Natives” clients. An information age with connected potential clients having instant information, communication,

multimedia and entertainment and social networking tools is a new era that no old business market plan can realistically compete with using the current marketing approaches. In the past technology has been used as a supplement to marketing. As businesses get more comfortable with technology it becomes a support but until it becomes integrated with marketing we will be the clients of the future in their world.

This 30 day process will take you from using Social Networking to a process which will increase your clout on the web so you can leverage the strength of these new communication tools to sell product, create a digital reputation, and control your digital footprint. If you have never used social network site, if you are a casual user, or if you are an experienced user this process will have something which will increase your ability to control the flow of information from your personal, business or product social network sites. Each day will have an activity which will increase your understand and show you how to create a powerful interconnected network of your creation.

I will try to use common language to explain some of these processes which should make it easier for develop a plan and execute it. Social Network sites refer to any site where users follow, like, share, communicate and build a group of people with common interests. For 13 years I have used these sites to build my network to learn about online teaching and personal development. This is referred to as my PLC...my personal learning community. My personal learning community is made up of a number of people from numerous social networking sites with common interests who share research, news and interesting items on common topic which are of interest to me. For me in the pas these topic have been education, specifically online education but currently it is business, project management and productivity. When designed correctly it is not necessary to rebuild your social network just because your interest change or job changes. The design will allow the followers, comments and shares to change with you as you grow or change. It important to follow the steps, and remember to build a success network take times but to design a network which can grow and continue to grow is possible in a shorter period of time. It will be necessary to dedicate a minimum of 15 minutes a day to your network. This small amount of effort will resulted in powerful online network. My network has given me more clout online than the Mayor of our city but less than the Premier of our province.

One of the steps which we will explore is the measuring of your clout so you can see your growth and what works and what does not. The reality is that by the time I am finished writing down this information, much of it will be outdated, but what you will get out of this is a framework in which you can add the new sites and approaches to continue to grow and change as the internet does the same. So the question is: **Are you ready to have your voice heard?**

It is not what you are saying so much as how many people will hear it, people will come back to hear it a second and third time if it is interesting but when developed correctly you can have your voice ripple across the internet with very little effort, and now starts the sharing of the secret of how to make that happen.

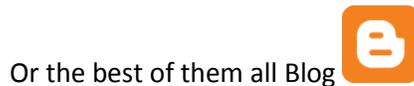
# Day One

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## Top Social Media Sites

To start your journey you need to choose one of the top social network sites which will be your base of operations.

When talking about the top social media sites, we are looking at:



Those are not in any order since it is fairly hard to find out which one is the most popular as the results are all skewed. It is one of the challenges that you will have when you try to find out how successful your network actually is as well. When you are finished the 30 day process you will be shocked at how many people start to quote, refer to, and mention the things you have done via your network. It has power.

**A personal sidebar.** 

*When I first started my network I used blogger, I started it because I wanted a place to store my thoughts and instructions to the teachers who were working in the Cyber School in which I was the administrator. This communication from me to my online teachers was on the web and could be found at that time by the robot crawlers and search engines (my blog was established in 2003). For a years I wrote the daily thoughts, posted daily quotes, made up daily cartoons, and share articles with my staff. Sometime during this first year, I was approached by University of British Columbia asking if I would like to use their blogging service to post my blog as many people were reading the entries. A request to which I agreed and left me wondering how many people were actually reading my blog. So I posted a messages asking could you reply to this post if you are not a teacher in my cyber school and if you are reading my blog. The responses shocked me, the location that responses came from shocked me, they came from all around the world, and I was overwhelmed and shocked. I thought I was talking to my staff*

*of 10 teachers when every day I was really standing on a mountain top yelling so loud people around the world were hearing me. I quickly tried to recall if I had posted anything that would be embarrassing, why was everyone reading this blog, maybe I should check my grammar and spelling more closely? All sort of things were running through my head and I started to ...*



*This shocked me into a couple of silent days on my blog, but I started to think...it is not just my staff reading and can I leverage this to make a name for myself and for the online school in which I worked. My writing according to some comments were interesting because I was writing without worrying about who was reading them. I was just posting my thoughts, opinions, humor and processes. I was not concerned about what people thought or if the grammar and spelling were of grad school quality, and after checking I can say I was being a professional and had not posted anything which would make my mother blush. So after the initial shock of being heard by so many I went back to my normal daily posts and continue to write like I was talking to my staff since that is what attracted people to the blog in the first place. But always in the back of my mind was wow... a lot of people are reading my stuff! This could be useful.*

My base of operations is on the blogger site  .

It is the Teaching and Developing Online Blog  .

It is where I started and I have not moved from a blog being my base. You will need to choose a base of operations. If you decided to use a blog the two most commonly used software for creating

blogs are blogger  and WordPress  . They are both very good blogging software, so use whichever one you like. Don't send me a bunch of comments about which one is better than the other, it is like the Mac and PC users, loyal until death. You can use any type of blog as long as it has an RSS feed generator. I have never seen a blog that does not but just in case. If you do not know what an RSS feed is...do not panic! At this stage of the game, it is not that important and if you do not know what it is then use the blogger or wordpress software.

I am going to use Project Management terminology to make this process clear.

**The Project:**



- Building a Foundation for a Social Media Network.

**Deliverable** (is the noun):



- Establish a base network (A single social network site)

**Tasks** (is a verb):



- Decide what you are going to use as the base.
- Register for it and create your first entry.

In normal English the project will never change for the 30 days. The **Project** is the overall goal, it is what we are trying to achieve, and it is what we are going to build. The **Deliverable** is what we are going to create, it will be a thing. How we are going to create it is called the **Tasks**.

When deciding which one of the four you are going to use some thought should be put into it.

The four that I am talking about are **Twitter** , **Facebook** , **Google+**  or **Blog** .

As I said I decided to use a blog just because it is not as restrictive like the Twitter's limit on the number of characters, but is very similar to what you can do in Facebook and Google+. If I was a betting man, I think Google+ is increasing in size while the Facebook is starting to lose some ground. However my wife will not allow me to bet so pick the one that you like best. Since it will be difficult to write these instructions from four different perspectives I will be writing them from the perspective of the blog being the base. The blog software as stated will be blogger.

Whichever the four you decide to use, you will need to on this day, register yourself or your business and enter your first entry.

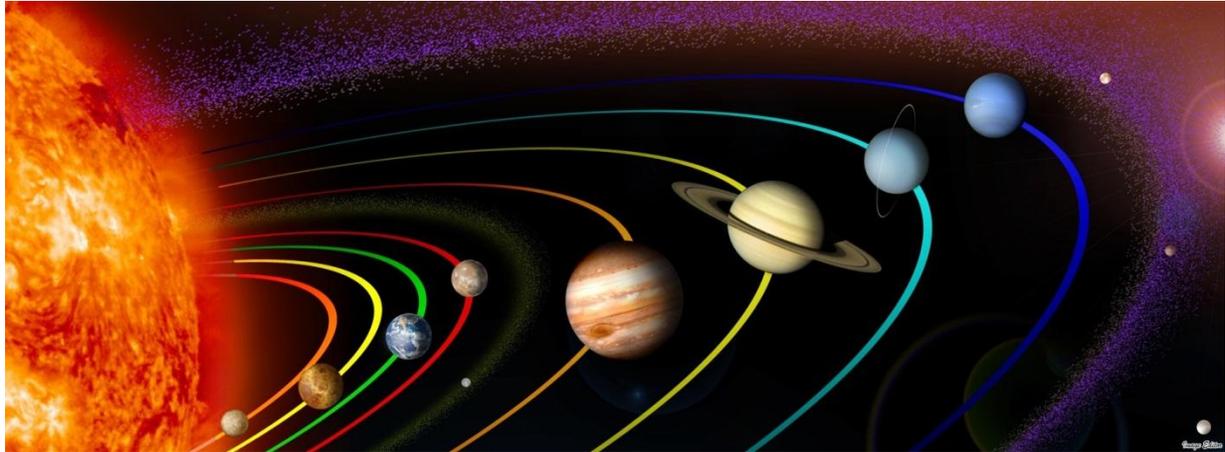

YouTube is an awesome source of tutorials...so if any of the videos above don't tell you what you need to know then search for a better one.

This ends the first day to you becoming a social media rock star. Be patient, day two will be here soon enough. If you are bored, maybe do a few more entries into your new base network site. Get use to using it, look up some tutorials on how to better use the software because it is your base. It is the core of your whole network it is like the sun in our solar system.



# Day Two

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## Creating our base, sun or main site

In day one we created the sun or the base of our network. The reason we create a base is so that we can use a single point of entry into our network. That does not mean you always have to use that entry point but it does mean that if you want an entry to reach as many people as possible the base needs to have the information so it can be picked up by a process and added to all the other social network tools. My most powerful tool is twitter and accounts for 52% of all the clicks (reads, contacts, or shares) but I never write or even read anything in twitter. Twitter is not a bad social networking tool in actual fact it rocks but for me it comes down to time.

*I love Google, when I have a specific question that I am trying to answer there is nothing better, I ask the question and normally get the answer. There are some tricks to using search engines effectively and some are shown in the following YouTube video: <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=DahGSReGx3M>*

*But searching for personal learning material means you have to know the question and this is limiting. What happens if I want to learn more about leadership and I have typed leadership into Google and have read many of the articles that come up as popular? For me to stay current and up to date on a topic I want the best articles and the newest articles sent to me, I don't even know the questions and just want the internet to come to me. There are many great tools out there to make that happen...for me I read the articles on an app called Zite. The great thing about that tool is it learns what I like and then finds articles with a similar theme or info and every morning I get another set of articles to read on topics of interest. This is the internet coming to you, rather than you going to it. As your social network grows and you surround yourself with like-minded people who share on the net as well, they will start to send you articles and ideas and then the synergy starts to grow and then is when you start to see the power in building a personal learning community and in social networking. When you reach that stage, then you start to post your questions to your personal learning community members rather than google.*

*The internet should come to you; it is so last year to have to go to the internet.*

So today we want to multiply the network to include the other of the top social networking sites. I work with blog as my base or sun and then I want to add other sites or planets to circle my sun. The blogger site for me is the base, then twitter, then facebook, and then google+

- Establish four other sites or planets (Linkin has been added it is not a good base but does reach an interesting market of people)



### **Tasks** (is a verb):

- Register for each of the four which you are not currently registered
- Create a single first entry for each.

At the end of the day you should have accounts in each of the four sites listed.

Twitter, Facebook, Google+, Linkin, Blog

Each of these four are slightly different and it will take you a little time to get each of your four up and running but it will be time well spent. In the end each of these sites will reach a different type of user

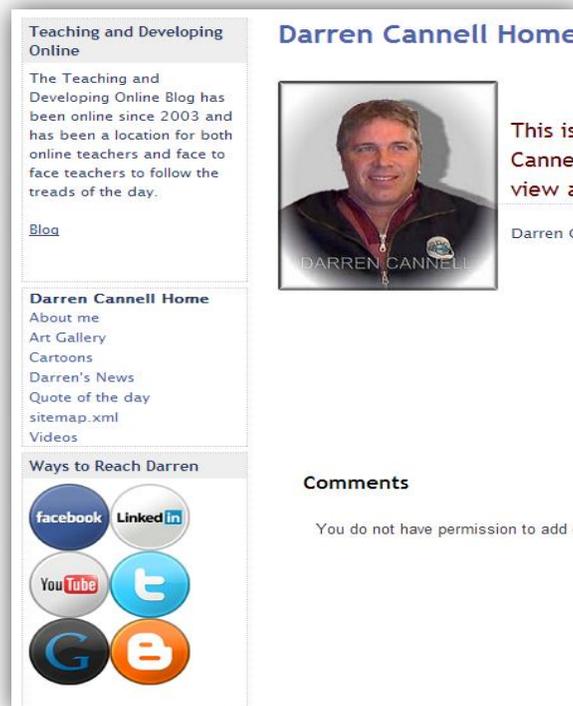

It was very simple but the best for me. In a nutshell, find someone with identical interests and look at who he follows and then follow the same. Choose the person carefully and follow who he is following not who is following him. There is a big difference, if he/she followed them then it was a conscious decision to follow that persons tweets. You might have to do with a couple of different people and some time will be needed to sort through the people you follow and there are many tools to make that easier.

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## Facebook

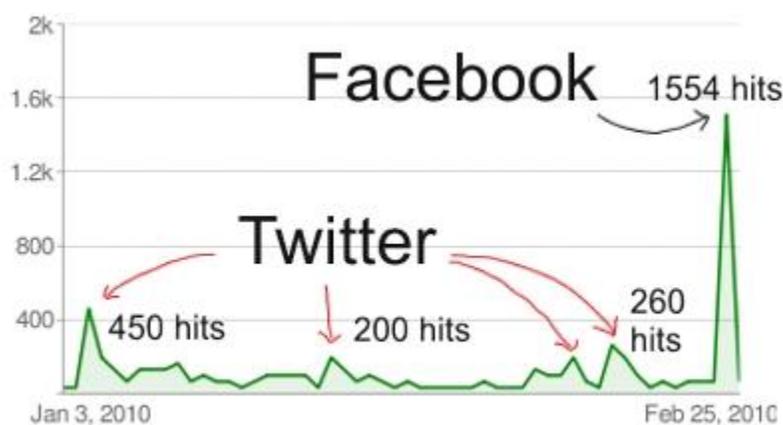
The social network that today will focus on is Facebook. Facebook is a tricky social network when you try to leverage it for business reasons. From a personal point of view it is very easy to share, but how do you make sure that your personal does not get mixed into the business end. Facebook in its attempts make money started to invite people to use it for more of a business focus hence the Facebook pages which started to appear. The articles and websites shared here is a historical look at the change of design and how to leverage it from a business point of view.

### Facebook vs Twitter experiment

I had created a video in October of 2009 called You Can't Be My Teacher. This Youtube video had **1281** hits in the first month. It continued to climb right into the New Year and had **2226** hits (More than all my other 300+ videos put together. On January 4 2010, I started an experiment, I wanted to see if Twitter or Facebook was a better way to spread an idea.

My Twitter's account, I have tried to surround myself with teacher, online educators and people in education...there are **1624** people following my postings. I mentioned the video in three different postings, the first generated a **450** hit spike, the second generated **200** hit spike and the third generated **260** hit spike and were spread out over two months period. A total of **4887** hits occurred during this two month period.



Then I decided to introduce Facebook into this experiment, I have **627** friends made up of family, friends, ex-students and peers. I posted 12 image with link to the video in my photos folder and then tag all my Facebook friends for a single day. This single day produced **1554** hits on the video and generated a pile of comments.

My conclusions to the very scientific experiment was that Facebook can be a powerful tool to spread the word if you spam tag your friends, while twitter used as it was designed can also be an powerful way of getting the word out there.

I would like to thank all my twitter PLN and my Facebook friends for being participants in my education pursuits.

# Day Eleven

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## Do you ever sleep?

When the thirty days are done, you are going to start getting the questions...do you ever sleep? How can find the time to handle a social network? I spend 15-25 minutes in the morning reading the articles and sites which are sent to me via some tools that I will explain later in this post. The old style of using the internet was to use a search engine type in a question and then read the information that is found. Nice process but so old school. I want the power of the search engine and technology to go out there on the web and find the information that I want before I know I want it. Nice idea and so very bright people developed a few tools that will do just that. Google is starting to get better at that as it is constantly collecting data about my online activity. But they use it to target ads tailored to my interests and they are very good at it. But take that same thought and apply it to me and my interests and send me articles which I might be interested in...now we are talking....

The use to use rss feed readers like Google reader but it is shutting down. It is a good way to stay on top of the new entries in a whole pile of different blogs and can be a good way to follow a topic. I don't use readers any more but there are replacements for Google reader for those people who want to use this process. RSS stands for Rich Site Summary or Really Simple Syndication and is produced by blogs and other sharing sites. You can then add a list of blogs to a reader and then in a single location read all the new posting on a set of blogs that are written by people you would follow and would like to read their new posts. Some feed readers that are pretty good are Digg Reader, AOL Reader, Feedly, and RSS Bot. Since I don't use this process any more I will not spend a lot of time talking about it. Search each of the four above and I am sure you will find one that will work for you.

The process that I use to collect information that I share on my network currently is via a great little app that works on most mobile tools. This tool is Zite. [Http://zite.com](http://zite.com)

I have no idea how it works but it does, every morning I open the app on my tablet and read all the new articles, blog entries and information that this program has learned that I like. It keeps getting better by me using it to share on my social network and I telling it which articles I like and over time it just keeps getting better. The risk is that it will get so good at knowing what I like that it will not show me anything other than stuff that is in perfect alignment with my views, which could be harmful and just support bad ideas. A smart person once told me that in this information age you can make a statement you want and there will be someone on the internet which will have the same view to support your good ideas and your bad ideas. So, reading both sides of a story is important but I am way off topic. A similar tool is one called Quora...check it out, it is the same but different.

The best and most popular way to build a following on your network is to post your own writing and your own thoughts, but for those of us with a life this takes dedication and time. Both of which I am lacking so I share other peoples stuff and when I find that time write some pearl of wisdom which I hope are appreciated.

If you are going to write your own entries you might like HubSpot.

A few key thoughts, be yourself, pick a passion to blog about, be different, don't write grad student style essays (unless that is the focus of your entry), don't sell, have an opinion, and above all share.

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## If this then that

Today we are going to start to introduce a tool which will tie your social networking sites together. It is great to have four social networking sites but to maintain each individually is a time consuming process. In the last five years I am approximately registered and sending information to over 30 different social networking sites, each one has follows each one has its own unique way of presenting information. Up until this point we have been talking about four main ones. But as you see this process you will start to understand how I can handle more and more sites and dedicate less and less time to each.

My main base social media is my Blogger blog... so anything that I would like to have shown on my network I make sure it is posted as a blog entry. The blog entry can be text, audio, video, images basically anything electronic that you want to share. Then the connection has to be made between my main base to all the other three social media sites that we talked about from days gone by...

The tool that I use to connect these is one called If-this-then-that... <http://www.IFTTT.com>

It is a very simple to use tool...these instructions are taken right from the site,,,and I could not have said it better so...

**What is IFTTT?** IFTTT is a service that lets you create powerful connections with one simple statement:



## Channels

Channels are the basic building blocks of IFTTT. Each Channel has its own Triggers and Actions. Some example Channels are:

So as instructions...let us connect blogger to twitter...

This is called a recipe

**If blogger (rss feed) has a new entry then post it into twitter.**

### Triggers

The **this** part of a Recipe is a Trigger. The trigger for this is an new entry in the blog

The **that** part of a Recipe is an Action. The action is to write a twitter entry.

### Ingredients

Pieces of data from a Trigger are called Ingredients. For example, the Ingredients of an Email Trigger could be: subject, body, attachment, received date, and the sender's address.

# Day 14

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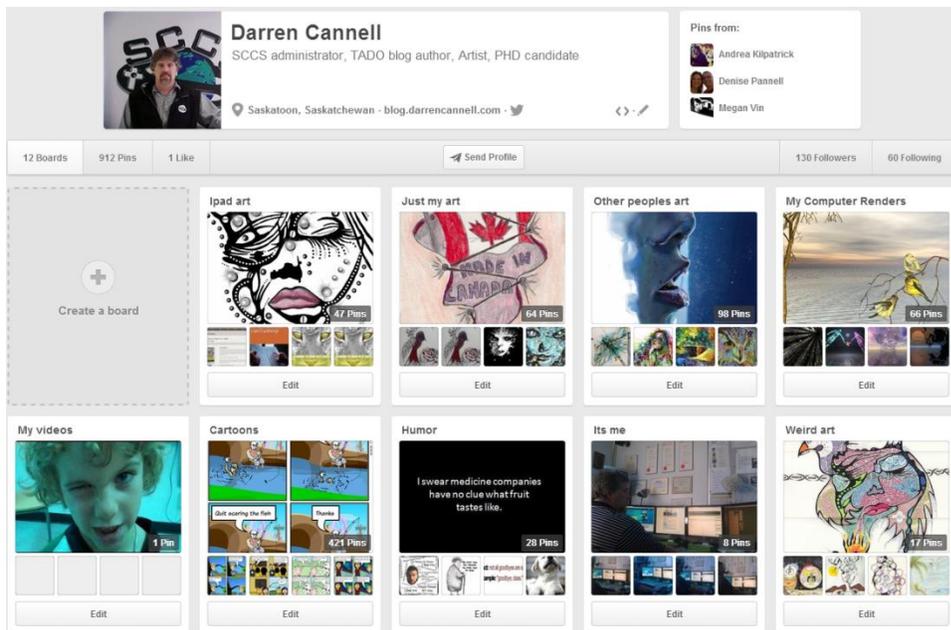
## Pinterest

The social networking site that we are going to explore today is a unique one that is growing by leaps and bounds. It will take a second to figure out how to best use this to expand your business and your personal clout. This site is called Pinterest. [Http://pinterest.com](http://pinterest.com)

From a conceptual standpoint this is the digital version of the old digital cork board that you had in your room or office where you pinned articles, images or things that interest you. The description is added to describe what each one of your boards contains.

# Day 15

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## Video Day

Today is video day, I am going to talk a little bit about videos and how they can be used to increase your clout. A picture is worth a thousand words so what is 17 pictures a second worth...beats me; I am not very good at math. But I can tell you that my clout increased when I started to leverage videos in my portfolio. At first videos were not very common place but now that everyone's phone, laptop and many desktops have the ability to produce videos, everyone is doing it. When I first started to make videos I spent a lot of time scripting my message and trying to make sure I have all the words just right. But as I got more comfortable and set myself a challenge of a video a week, I found I got more comfortable and then just shared. My thoughts of the days, a challenge I was trying to overcome or an issue that I actually fixed. All of these short videos became part of the sharing that I did via my social media sites. Short is the key word here, I try to keep my videos below two minutes and then just talk like I am telling a story to my son or a friend, this seems to work for me. At first you will not be very good at it, but the videos will still be of value because of the sharing. If it is a topic which is challenging you in your profession or life, there is someone out there going through the same thing. Share and share and do some more sharing...over time your videos will get better as you become more comfortable and your messages will be of value but like anything else it will take some practice to find your rhythm and to figure out what people want to hear...it is all about the stats but that is a conversation or another day.

My most popular video was a challenge video for my teachers at cyber school which was used my child as the actor. It was called "You can't be my teacher".

How popular and controversial it became, took me by surprise. I had just bought a new flip video camera and in about 15 minutes, got my son to say a lot of lines that I fed him as I videotaped him. Then I edited the video in about 30 thirty minutes cutting out my voice and stringing the lines together. He at the time had no idea what the video was about as the lines were not in order and he was young. I then posted the videos for the teachers in my cyber school and it started to gain popularity through my social network because I put it on my blog, which then fed it to Twitter, Facebook and so on and so on and in no time at all it had over 100,000 views which for a video about school is just crazy...and the comments started to flow...about how rude this child is and this video is wrong in so many ways...in the end more people liked it than people who disliked it but it did gain a following. It has been shown at conferences and in at schools around the world. Not bad for a video which I had put together for my staff but it does illustrate how powerful video can be in your portfolio.

My second most popular video was a How to...video...called How to increase wifi signal...

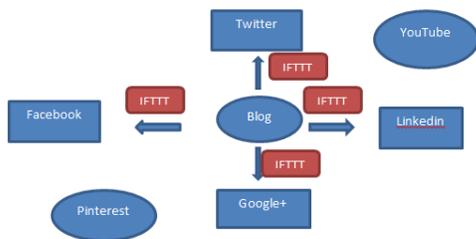
# Day 16

After 15 days you should have a minimum of seven different social network sites in your network. The only element tying them together is IFTTT.com and it should connect the five: Blog (sun), and four planets...Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn and Google+. Hovering around the outside is pinterest and Youtube. These two support your network by giving you a place on the cloud to store your videos, and images which you would then add in your entries in your blog (sun) which in turn would then be fed out to your planets.

Keep straight in your mind the best way for you to feed information into your network is a key point that you will have to keep coming back to in order for you to be aware of what is the best place to put the information that you would like to share. I do post some stuff separately to Facebook so it does not get splashed across my network. Facebook is the most personal of all the sites that I have on my network, so I use it once and a while to share picture of my family with other family members and friends. If I have an entry that I want to splash across the whole network then I always post it in the blog as that is my sun which everything else is built around.

# Day 17

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## Timing

When is the best time to post to your social network. There have been studies done and you can run one on your own by trying different times and seeing the responses. You will very quickly see a pattern as your followers grow. But it is a catch 22 because if you do not post at a good time then on some social media your numbers will not grow.

# Day 18

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## Define yourself

Now that you have started to use bufferapp.com you will need to connect it to your network by using IFTTT.com to tie it all together. I use the blog as my main social network and then I add all the interesting articles that I like, and the entries that I write into the blog. This is really good if people follow my blog, subscribe to it but currently all my entries are posted to Twitter, Facebook, LinkedIn and Google+ by IFTTT.com. This is a good thing to do but if you post five or six articles at a time to will flood your social network sites which is ok, but it does tend to bother people when they see so many entries from a single person so by using bufferapp.com you can space them out during the day.

So here are the steps I use, I read ZITE app on my tablet in the morning...remember ZITE learns what I like and collects the latest articles, blog entries and news on the topics that I am interest in...as I read these I have a choice of what I would like to do if I like the articles, you can send them to facebook, twitter, linkedin, google+, the blog or to bufferapp.com. I have recently decided to send them to bufferapp.com and then added them to my blog but he best way is to add them to your blog and then use IFTTT to take your blog rss feed and send it to bufferapp.com which will then space them out and send them to all the other four social networking sites.

The tools to use are IFTTT and bufferapp.com and you will need to use both of these tools and figure out how they fit into your plans as a social networking person

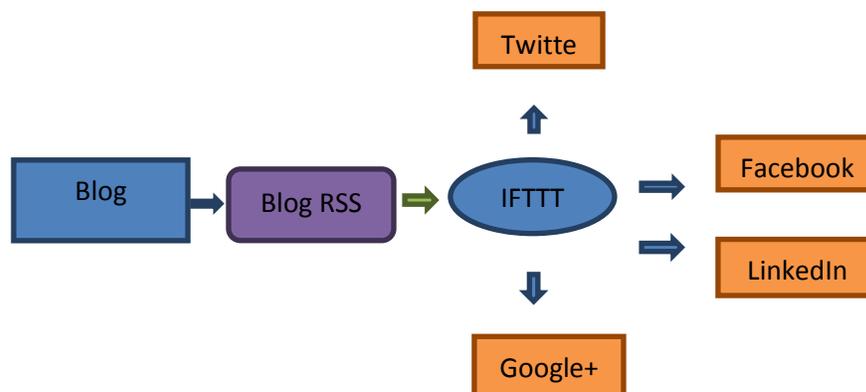
### Bloggging: Who should, and Why

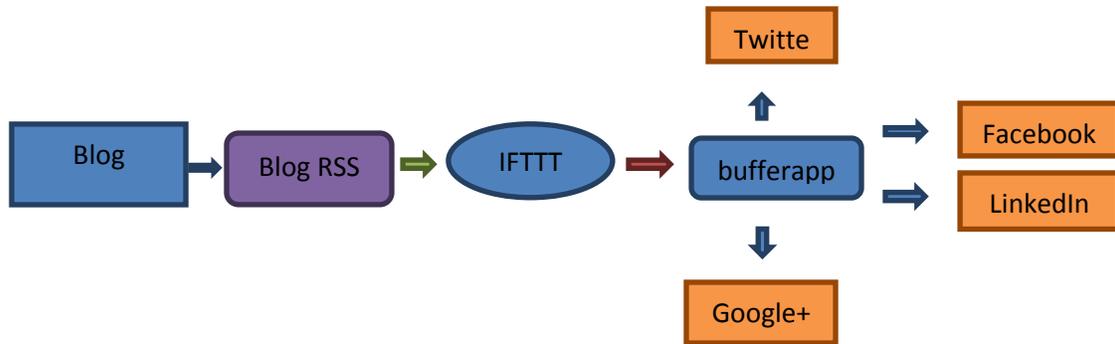

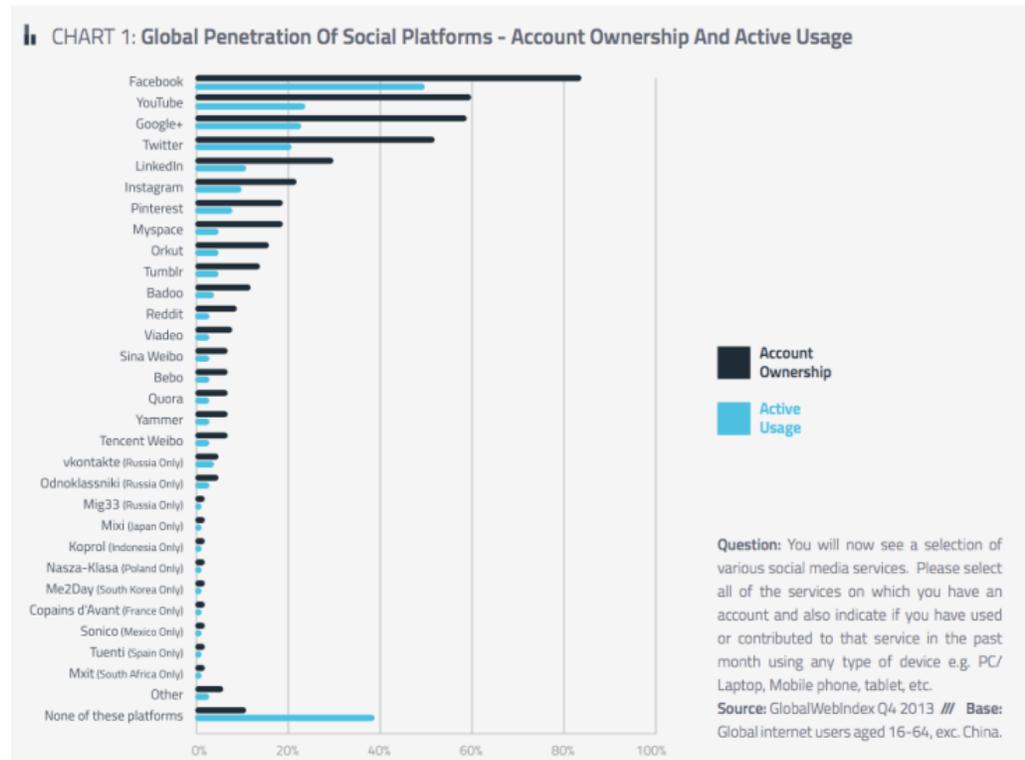

## Cyber school visual literacy

"It has been said throughout time that a picture could be worth a thousand words. As you can imagine though, for each individual that views it, the words can be decidedly different. It has been stated that during the time of Martin Luther only 3-5% of the population could read the written word. In order to send a message or to just simply get one across, the messenger had to be extremely resourceful. When Luther lit the fire of the Protestant Reformation, he fanned the flames using persuasive images disguised as art. Some of these would even be called propaganda in today's thinking. Those for whom the messages were intended had little trouble deciphering the meaning. It is now most ironic that in our present, mostly literate society, we still see the use of images as a major means of influence in TV, movies, Public Service ads, and especially political campaigns. It's not what people are saying that's troublesome, but how it is they are saying it" (Macdonald 2006 ¶ 1).

The use of images is nothing new to the author. For seventeen years as an art teacher, images have been front and center in his life. For twenty plus years he has been a professional artist applying the use of color and composition to create a feeling, a message or just an interesting image. These images he has displayed since 1995 on the internet within a virtual art gallery. The creation of this gallery is the catalyst to his position as the creator and administrator of the Saskatoon Catholic Cyber School (SCCS). The virtual gallery forced the learning web design and html. At the same time he was required to learn to manipulate digital images. During this stage he also experimented with digital drawing programs like Corel Draw and Bryce. This gallery is called DDC Art Gallery and can be seen at the following URL:

Teaching art meant that he spent all day thinking about composing images and assisting others to create and compose their own images. The art teacher stage of his life ended in 2000 when he started his role at the SCCS.

"What's imperative is the creation of a style that becomes a culture linking you to the community. You can only do that through good design" (Roddick, 2007 ¶ 2).

The first use of images and design would be the Saskatoon Catholic Cyber School website. But even before that was the design of a logo for the school. Creating a simple logo was a challenge and it can be seen at the following URL:

Once an acceptable logo was established we, being a Cyber School, created the front of the school as a website. Cheong (2007) explains the thought behind the Cyber School website design by stating "Design is essentially problem-solving. Devising a visual solution to communicate an intended message effectively. Why use ten effects to treat a graphic element when you can do it with one "(¶ 3)?

As the Cyber School grew so did the number of teacher/developers involved in the programming. It was necessary to design an efficient online tool for communication with the growing group. The system chosen was a Movable type blog.

This blog has grown to be a worldwide blog and has gone through many design changes.

The designs were done with an understanding that Goodman (2008) explains "No one will visit, let alone bookmark your site if your pages look unprofessional, long-winded or in worst case, having a bad design..."(¶ 1). The last of these designs can be seen at:

The color of the courses is changed on a continuous basis. Valentine's Day and the week leading up to it have had a pink and red coloring. October has the Halloween colors of black and orange. Next to our changing the format and icons in the courses, this is commented upon more than any other changes we make in the course. It is interesting how much of an impact a change of color and icons can make on the first impression of a student upon seeing the course. They tend to get accustomed to a color theme and then it is changed. It keeps things fresh.

Being the administrator of the Cyber School for the last eight years has, in my mind, forced me to abandon my interest in images and the graphic sides of my nature. The Visual Literacy in the Digital World course made the author stop and think about the visual aspect of his role in the Cyber School which has been outlined briefly in this paper. In actual fact a large amount of visual work has been done in the last eight years and it is this author's hope that it has made the Saskatoon Catholic Cyber School a strong entity because of this. As an artist and administrator this author will continue to apply, share and use his visual literacy interest and experience in his role because:

"An image can convey thoughts, ideas, or events to which words alone sometimes cannot do justice. Images can thrill us, like the images sent back to Earth from the Mars Rover missions. They can inspire us, like the photo of the American flag raised over the rubble of the World Trade Center by three New York firefighters on September 11, 2001. They can be heartbreaking, like the image of Oklahoma City firefighter Chris Fields carrying tiny Baylee Almon out of the wreckage of the Oklahoma City bombing. They can incite outrage, like the photos of the stacked bodies of Holocaust victims; they can bring us face to face with the worst inhumanities imaginable. They can bring tears to our eyes, lift our spirits, or sink our hearts. Images are powerful, and with such power must come responsibility for their prudent and thoughtful use." (Tagliere, 2007 ¶1)

What are feeds?

I see "RSS", "XML", and "Atom" out there, but I don't know how I might use these links when I find them.

Feeds are a way for websites large and small to distribute their content well beyond just visitors using browsers. Feeds permit *subscription* to regular updates, delivered automatically via a web portal, news reader, or in some cases good old email. Feeds also make it possible for site content to be packaged into "widgets," "gadgets," mobile devices, and other bite-sized technologies that make it possible to display blogs, podcasts, and major news/sports/weather/whatever headlines just about anywhere.

Business Social Media Campaigns to be successful will require a key person who will need to be the front line for the campaign. This person should be fairly computer literate and should have some personal social clout as proof to their understanding of the process. It is possible to develop the skills necessary to spearhead the business social media campaign but a business would be further ahead to identify the necessary skills for a future hire. A full-time online marketing agent might be a way to go if the business has identified online as the key method of marketing. Social Media Campaign has no boundary which is one of the major strengths of the process, it is as easy to use this marketing plan for people in your city as it is to target another area of the country or world in which you do business. My goal of any modern day business plan is to plan for growth as you will never know where your next market might spring up and it would be a shame to have to redevelop because you never planned big enough.

The following article although targeted at Google+ has a four main points which can be applied to a complete marketing plan and not just Google+.

### **1. Be platform agnostic and focus on compelling visual content.**

Brocart suggests their presence on Google+ is all about one thing, "giving them a reason to come back, not just for offers but also for great content,"

### **3. Listen before speaking and build communities**

Many businesses get it wrong on social media since they insist on talking as opposed to consistently listening to what their audience has to say to inform the company's future messaging. Cadbury is one of the most successful businesses on Google+ today, one reason being that it really listens to its audience from the very beginning.
